
WORKSHOP GOALS






Our Tuning Protocol

Tangible equity tool for Liberatory Education, CRP, and the ES lens

- How can this work promote your students' strengths and sustain/uplift their identities?
- How can this work respond to the needs of your students & their community?
- How can this work push students to think critically about their world & motivate them to make it better?
